## Disappearing Nine-Patch

Easily construct a quilt pattern with a complex appearance by piecing together quilt blocks made from simple nine-patch blocks. Different arrangements plus varied fabric choices yield striking patterns. Great project for a beginner or anyone who wants to create a quick and attractive quilt.

## Supply List:

- sewing machine, electrical cords, foot pedal, machine manual
- electrical power strip and heavy duty extension cord
- quarter-inch sewing machine foot
- machine needles, straight pins
- fabric scissors, small fabric scissors, seam ripper
- thread (beige or gray for piecing, or a coordinating color)
- rotary cutter, cutting mat, ruler
- there will be one regular sized ironing station available at the class


## Project: Baby Size Quilt

- Finished size - approximately 33 " x 40 "
- Fabric - your choice for the project:
$\checkmark$ For a three-color quilt, $1 / 2$ yard of the background color, $1 / 2$ yard of the coordinating or contrasting color, and $1 / 4$ yard of the focal point color
$\checkmark$ For a multicolor quilt, nine different colors in $1 / 4$ yard or fat quarter sizes. Choose one as your focal point (bright and/or contrasting with the others)
$\checkmark$ Use a 5 " charm pack, or a 10 " layer cake (cut into 5 " squares) of different coordinating fabrics
$\checkmark$ Use 5 " squares of various I Spy fabrics, a background fabric and a focal point fabric
- Needed to finish your quilt:
$\checkmark 1 \frac{1}{2}$ yards backing fabric
$\checkmark 11 / 2$ yards batting
$\checkmark 1 / 2$ yard for binding

Note: If you choose to make a larger quilt, bring more fabric.
