Learn to sew a curved seam in constructing a Drunkard's Path quilt block. Then use this simple block to design an eye-catching quilt. Your finished quilt will look stunning in jewel tone or Batik fabrics as well as more traditional patterns. Use your quilt as a wall hanging or table topper, or sew more blocks for a larger size quilt.

## Supply List:

- sewing machine, electrical cords, foot pedal, machine manual
- electrical power strip and heavy duty extension cord
- quarter-inch sewing machine foot
- machine needles, straight pins
- fabric scissors, small fabric scissors, seam ripper
- thread (beige or gray for piecing, or a coordinating color)
- rotary cutter, cutting mat, ruler
- there will be one regular sized ironing station available at the class
- free motion quilting foot or walking foot (if you have time to quilt your project)


## Project: Quilt

- Finished size - 7 " blocks ( 16 blocks) $-28 " \times 28 "$ quilt
- Fabric:
$\checkmark$ For a two-color quilt, $1 / 2$ yard of each color
$\checkmark$ For a multicolor quilt, several different colors in $1 / 4$ yard or fat quarter sizes
- Needed to finish your quilt:
$\checkmark 1$ yard backing fabric
$\checkmark 1$ yard batting
$\checkmark 1 / 2$ yard for binding

Note: If you choose to make a larger quilt, bring more fabric.
